

Combined Basic & Advanced Fire Fighting (STRCTR-125)

Length 5 Days

Objective

Conducted at Broward Fire Academy's state-of-the-art marine fire fighting training center in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, the students have the advantage of on-site, multiple, live fire exercises. The realistic live fire training is combined with classroom work and open forum discussions with a focus on personal safety, teamwork, command & control and fire prevention to prepare; the student to meet the unique challenges of marine fire fighting.

Each student who successfully completes this course will be knowledgeable of and have proficiency in Basic and Advanced Firefighting and meeting this requirement with Section A-VI/1-2 and A-VI/3 of the STCW Code, as amended. This emphasis if the training is in Organization, tactics and command as follows:

1. Control of Firefighting Operations
2. Organize and Train Fire Parties
3. Inspection of Fire Systems (detection and extinguishing)
4. Fire Investigations, incidents and reporting

This Course is USCG Approved and STCW Compliant. The course certificate will state:

“Any applicant who has successfully completed our Combined Basic & Advanced Fire Fighting course will satisfy the following USCG requirements 1) Fire Prevention and Fire Fighting per STCW Code Section A-VI/1; 2) Advanced Fire Fighting per STCW Code Section A-VI/3; 3) Fire Prevention and Fire Fighting per 46 CFR 11.302 (a)(2) and 46 CFR 12.602 (a)(2); 4) Basic and Advanced Fire Fighting per 46 CFR 11.201(h)(2) and 46 CFR 11.201(h)(3); 5) Advanced Firefighting per 46 CFR 11.303 (a); and 6) Firefighting requirements for a national tankerman endorsement in 46 CFR 13.201,(c)(3), 13.301(c)(3), 13.401(d), and 13.501 (c)(3). 7) The specific TASKs from the following national guidance documents: a) Task 17.3.A from NVICs 10-14 and 11-14 for Master/Chief Mates; b) Tasks 13.1.B and 13.1.C from NVIC 15-14 for Chief Engineer/Second Engineering Officer; c) Tasks 14.1.A, 14.2.A, 14.3.A and 14.4.A from NVIC 12-14 for OICNW; d) Task 12.1.A from NVIC 17-14 for OICEW 8) Basic Firefighting Refresher only requirements of 46 CFR 11.302(e) and 12.6029(e) ; 9) Advanced Firefighting Refresher requirements for 46 CFR 11.201(h)(1) and 11.303(e)”

This 5-day combined basic and advanced shipboard fire fighting course provides extensive knowledge, and instruction in a variety of marine fire fighting subjects. This course is intended to meet the training requirements as listed above in the USCG Approved and STCW Compliant Course Certificate section.
