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RE: Notice of Reapproval – Course Catalog - 2024

By the authority of 38 United States Code (USC) §§ 3671(a), 3672(a), 3673(a), the Florida State Approving Agency for Veterans' Education and Training (SAA) grants reapproval of this nonaccredited private/non-profit institution in accordance with the provisions of 38 USC § 3672(b)(2)(A)(i). In accordance with 38 USC 3678, a copy of this approval notification, including documents and information submitted to this office will be sent to the United States Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).

This approval supersedes all prior approvals for your institution. The date of determination is March 8, 2024. The effective date of this approval is January 1, 2024, and it **will expire December 31, 2024**, unless prior to that date, a significant change occurs, or a new catalog is published for this institution. The date a completed submission was received is February 9, 2024. This institution must continue to comply with state and federal regulations as referenced in this letter. It is important to note that this approval may be further impacted by Public Law 116-315, The Johnny Isakson and David P. Roe, M.D. Veterans Health Care and Benefits Improvement Act of 2020. The SAA may request additional information pertaining to approval requirements following enactment and enforcement of this recent law.

Conditions of Approval:

As a reminder, the official signatory for this institution agrees to comply with a number of requirements listed in the signed and dated True and Correct Statement (BSA Form 1200/1200a, as appropriate). Compliance with all is required for the institution to retain approval status for VA Education Assistance. The following is a summary of certain requirements to emphasize their importance:

- The institution will keep written records of progress for each enrolled veteran or eligible person.
- A written record must be on file which shows the previous education and training of the veteran or eligible person has been evaluated.

Policy Requirements and SAA Attestations

<u>ACADEMIC CALENDAR</u>: Page 8, Addendum 2. The institution includes individual program enrollment dates and legal holiday closures.

STATE LICENSING: The institution is exempt from state licensure.

<u>ADEQUATE SPACE/EQUIPMENT/INSTRUTIONAL MATERIAL/INSTRUCTOR PERSONNEL</u>: Page 3, Addendum 1. The institution meets standards regarding adequate space, equipment, instructional material and personnel. It is determined the institution meets this requirement.

ADMINISTRATOR, DIRECTOR, OWNER, AND INSTRUCTOR QUALIFICATIONS/REPUTATION AND REPUTATION AND CHARACTER. Pages Addendum 1. The institution meets CIE standards regarding staff and instructor qualifications, ethical standards, and continuing education. Therefore, it is determined the institution meets this requirement.

ADVERTISING/ENROLLMENT PRACTICES: The institution provided a screenshot of web site. The institution does not use "VA Approved" to advertise. The institution is not using Veteran Emblems (or logos) or those of Military Branches. Permission is required to do so. The institution does not reference GI Bill® on its materials or pages. Please note, if the institution decides to utilize the registered trademark, it must prominently display the following statement, "GI Bill® is a registered trademark of the United States Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)." It is determined the institution does not utilize erroneous or deceptive advertising or enrollment practices.

<u>ATTENDANCE</u>: Page 9. The institution has policy and regulations relative to leave, absences, tardiness and interruptions for unsatisfactory attendance. Nonaccredited institutions are required to record attendance and follow its policies. Therefore, it is determined the institution meets this requirement.

<u>COMPLETION</u>: Page 11. The institution issues a diploma upon successful completion of training. Therefore, it is determined the institution meets this requirement.

<u>CREDIT FOR PREVIOUS EDUCATION AND TRAINING</u>: Page 10. The institution has a prior learning policy and maintains a written record that indicates previous education and training has been evaluated and granted, as appropriate, with training time shortened and tuition reduced proportionately. Therefore, it is determined the institution meets this requirement.

ENROLLMENT LIMITS: 10 students per class.

<u>FINANCIAL SOUNDNESS</u>: No sanctions or issues regarding financial soundness were found in CIE actions. Therefore, it is determined the institution is financially sound and capable of fulfilling training requirements.

GI BILL® FEEDBACK SYSTEM REVIEW: The institution has no complaints pertaining to approval criteria, such as quality of education, accreditation, quality of instructors, or quality of equipment.

<u>LICENSE AND CERTIFICATION</u>: The institution provides the requirements for preparing students for state licensing requirements within each program. Therefore, it is determined the institution meets this requirement.

<u>PRO RATA REFUND</u>: Page 14. The institution has a pro rata refund policy regarding unused portions of tuition, fees, and other charges. Therefore, the institution meets this requirement.

STANDARDS OF PROGRESS: Page 9-10. Students who do not meet the minimum requirements may not be recertified for VA educational benefits until the student achieves satisfactory academic progress. The policies state the grading system and explain the conditions for interruption for unsatisfactory progress and the requirements for reinstatement. It is determined the institution meets this requirement.

<u>STUDENT CONDUCT</u>: Page 10, Handbook page 7-16. The institution includes policy and requirements relating to student conduct and conditions for dismissal are published and enforced. It is determined the institution meets this requirement.

STUDENT RECORDS: Page 9. Student records are maintained and include academic and financial folders that contain attendance, clock hours, grades, practical hours. It is determined the institution meets this requirement.

<u>TUITION AND FEES</u>: Pages 11, Addendum 2. The institution provides a tuition and fee schedule as well as costs for books, supplies, and all other charges. It is determined the institution meets this requirement.

PUBLISHED POLICIES REQUIRED FOR SAA REVIEW:

Penalty Prohibition: (applies to all institutions) Page 10-11. Public Law 115-407 Veterans Benefits Transition Act Of 2018 or 38 USC § 3679(e), as amended. The policy indicates that the institution will not impose financial or access penalties on the individual for a minimum of 90 days while awaiting VA payment. In addition, the institution will not require a covered individual to request a student loan to cover the pending VA payment. Students using Chapter 33 benefits will provide a Certificate of Eligibility, a written request to be certified, and/or information needed to properly certify the enrollment. Students enrolled using Veterans Readiness & Employment (Chapter 31) benefits will provide appropriate verification of benefits. It is determined the institution meets this requirement.

Qualifications for This Approval

Changes include, but are not limited to: ownership, chief administrative officers, location, licensure, profit status, accreditation, new catalog, etc. Failure to submit timely notification and/or deviation from information submitted to the Florida SAA, which served as a basis for this approval, may result in suspension or withdrawal of the institution's approval to participate in VA Educational Assistance.
