

## Breath Alcohol Testing Program— Alco-Sensor III and / or IV

**Length** 4 hours (½ day)

### Scope

This course is intended to train mariners on the breath alcohol device that will be used to perform a non-DOT breath sample screening for the presence of alcohol as stated in CFR 46 Sec 122, 46 CFR Part 4, Part 5, Part 16.

### Objective

The goal of the program is to provide training in:

- CFR procedural requirements
- Conforming products list
- Evidential Breath Alcohol Testing devices (EBT)
- Procedures for screening tests
- Use of non-DOT form (five scenarios)
- Demonstrate proficiency in operating the EBT that will be used for alcohol testing
- Interpretation of results
- Circumstances under which records are maintained and limitations regarding disclosure of records to unauthorized persons

### Entry standards

There are no restrictions on who can become a breath alcohol testing device operator. The knowledge of the CFRs and training on the device can be grasped by anyone of average competence providing they participate in class and demonstrate competence.
