

Bridge Resource Management (35-hour) (STRCTR-84)

Length 35 hours (5 days)

Objective

The objective of this course is to instruct the student in the areas relevant to Bridge Resource Management. In doing so, satisfy company, national and international regulations as stated in 46 CFR 11.202 (e) AND the Standards of Training Certification and Watchkeeping as amended tables- A-II/1, A-II/2, for competence in knowledge of the following:

- A thorough knowledge of the principles in keeping a navigational watch, and
- "Application of Leadership and Teamworking Skills"

The course supports the training outcomes related to these identified skills. In doing so, those candidates for certification at the management level of Chief Mate or Master, upon successful completion of an assessment for BRM principles in accordance with Control Sheet M-5-1D, and Control Sheets M-5-1A thru C in the use of ARPA will satisfy company, national, and international regulations for the Bridge Resource Management elements of the Watchkeeping competence as identified in STCW Code Table A-II/2.

This Course is USCG Approved and STCW Compliant. The course certificate will state:

"This course is hereby recognized as a Coast Guard Approved Training Course as outlined in Subpart C of Part 11, Title 46, Code of Federal Regulations. Any applicant who has successfully completed our *Bridge Resource Management (35-Hour) (STRCTR-84)* course will satisfy the Bridge Resource Management requirements of 46 CFR 11.202(e); the "Maintain a safe navigational watch," AND the "Application of Leadership and Team Working Skills" competencies of Table A-II/1 of the STCW Code, as amended. The practical assessments conducted in this course will be accepted as the equivalent of the following assessments from the National Assessment Guidelines for Table A-II/2 of the STCW Code, as amended: M-5-1A, M-5-1B, M-5-1C, and M-5-1D. Any approved instructor for this course is authorized to sign off for a successful demonstration on the students' control sheets. Applicants who have successfully completed our course need not present completed "Control Sheets" for these assessments in application for STCW certification."

Scope

The Bridge Resource Management course is a classroom and simulator-based course that is designed for the modern ships bridge personnel. The course topics and exercises are designed to expose human factors to the students, and to relay the importance of these factors in managing information and operations on the bridge of a modern day vessel.

Entry standards

Student minimum prerequisites are:

1. Hold a valid certificate / license as rating forming part of a navigational watch (RFPNW) or national equivalent, or
2. Hold a valid certificate / license as master, chief officer, second officer, or third officer.
